INTERIM UPDATE

In January 2022, West Moberly Corporate Alliance (WMCA) launched its ESG (Environmental, Social and Governance) program – the first Indigenous-led corporate program of its kind.

This initial update provides you with an aggregated summary of ESG datasets compiled by WMCA and its partner companies during the first half of 2022. By reporting publicly, WMCA seeks to build public trust and understanding regarding industrial activity undertaken in West Moberly First Nations and Treaty 8 Territory.

OUR COMMITMENT: Indigenous Reconciliation

WMCA aligns its business practices with ESG responsibility standards. We recognize commitments to Indigenous communities outlined in international instruments such as ILO Convention 169 and the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.

METHODOLOGY: Building Trust and Integrity

The <u>WMCA ESG Policy</u> and <u>ESG Action Plan</u> provides a detailed roadmap for West Moberly First Nations and its Corporate Alliance partners participating in the ESG program. ESG reporting includes both quantitative and qualitative data. Quantitative data is reported to WMCA by participating partners using a Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) Referenced reporting standard that measures factors selected during a materiality analysis. Qualitative data is provided to further demonstrate the ESG-related activities underway.



Key Steps

- 1. Each participant signs a Memorandum of Understanding with WMCA specifying the breadth and scope of each Partner's quarterly reporting.
- 2. WMCA aggregates the data and reports in the Annual Accountability Report and in this Interim Update.
- 3. WMCA meets with Partners quarterly and with Chief and Council annually to refine the program and its scope.

Next Steps for WMCA:

West Moberly Corporate Alliance will continue to work with Partner companies to conduct materiality analysis, track and accurately report ESG data relevant to WMCA projects and Treaty 8 Territory. Action items include:

- 1. Troubleshooting and refining reporting formats so Partner data tracking remains consistent and aligned with GRI reporting standards.
- 2. Working with Partner companies and WMFN leadership to expand and enhance the tracking over time, and improve the feedback loop of setting targets, acting, and reporting outcomes.
- 3. Present to WMFN members and community partners on the ESG program, and industry-indigenous engagement.
- 4. Establish a formal application process for prospective Partners that includes ESG criteria and provides for onboarding into the ESG program.
